On March 11, 2011 Fayette County Sheriff's Investigators assigned to the Tactical Narcotic Team (TNT) made five (5) arrests in connection with a search warrant that was executed at a residence on Perch Point in Peachtree City.

While conducting their investigation TNT investigators made two (2) arrests which led them to obtain a search warrant for the Peachtree City residence. The first arrest was made when an undercover TNT investigator purchased marijuana from an individual in the Kroger parking lot on Crosstown Drive in Peachtree City.

TNT investigators arrested Ryan William McDonald, 20, of Peachtree City in connection to this incident charging him with Criminal Sale of Marijuana, Possession of a Schedule II Narcotic, Possession of a Dangerous Drug, and Possession of Marijuana Less Than an Ounce.

The second arrest was made while TNT investigators were conducting surveillance on the residence on Perch Point. TNT investigators made the arrest when a traffic stop was made on a vehicle seen leaving the residence. The traffic stop was made on Crosstown Drive where investigators arrested Andrew Drake Wilson, 20, of Peachtree City charging him with a traffic related offense and Possession of Marijuana Less Than an Ounce.

These arrests lead TNT investigators to conduct a search warrant on the residence on Perch Point. During the search warrant TNT investigators made three (3) additional arrests. TNT investigators arrested Sebastian Prange, 21, and Ashley Hall, 21, both of Peachtree City and both being charged with Possession of Marijuana Less Than an Ounce. TNT investigators also arrested Tyler Joseph Moore, 21, of Peachtree City charging him with Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Distribute, Possession of a Firearm during the Commission of a Felony, Possession of a Dangerous Drug, and Possession of a Schedule II Narcotic.

The suspects in this case were taken to the Fayette County Jail.
