Fayette County Sheriff's Office Investigators with the assistance of the United States Marshal's Southeastern Regional Fugitive Task Force made an arrest on February 21, 2012 in connection with a home invasion case which occurred on December 3, 2010. Investigators have arrested Mark Anthony Hill, 41, of Lithonia and charged him three (3) counts of Kidnapping, two (2) counts of Armed Robbery, three (3) counts of Aggravated Assault and two (2) counts of Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon.

On December 3, 2010 at approximately 9:30 AM, Fayette County Sheriff's Office Deputies responded to a home invasion in progress at a residence on Kimberly Court in south Fayette County. When deputies arrived at the residence they discovered three adult victims had been handcuffed and robbed at gunpoint.

The victims told investigators that four suspects approached the front door of the residence on Kimberly Court and identified themselves as being law enforcement officers. The four suspects then entered into the home where they proceeded to handcuff the three victims. The criminal act continued as the four suspects produced handguns while assaulting the victims and stealing items of value from inside the residence before fleeing the scene. The victims were able to give Fayette investigators a possible suspect vehicle description of a white newer model Chevrolet Impala. None of the victims were injured during this incident.

Fayette investigators forwarded the description of the suspect vehicle to all Fayette County law enforcement agencies. Two of the suspects were apprehended by Fayette County Sheriff's Deputies when they stopped the suspect vehicle on Hwy 74 in north Fayette County where they were later convicted of the crime. Darius Gray is currently serving a 20 year sentence for his offenses and Michelle Perez is serving a 30 year sentence for her involvement. Octavious Harmon was the third perpetrator to be captured and later convicted where he is currently serving a 10 year sentence. Mark Hill is the fourth and final suspect arrested in connection with this incident and is currently being held at the Fayette County Jail pending trial.

Fayette County Sheriff's Office Investigators made two (2) arrests on February 16, 2012 in connection with a burglary which occurred earlier that day. Investigators have arrested Nico McFarland, 33, and Jacory Shondrell White, 33, both of Atlanta charging them both with Burglary. McFarland was additionally charged with Possession of Tools for the Commission of a Burglary.

This case involves White and McFarland entering into a vacant residence on Shenandoah Trace in north Fayette County with the intentions of stealing metal from inside.
