Fayette County Sheriff's Office Investigators made two (2) arrests in connection with two (2) residential burglaries which occurred on January 22, 2012. On February 16, Investigators arrested Shomari Qutrell Davis, 17, and on February 17, Investigators arrested Jawan Rashad Powell, 20, both from Clayton County. Investigators have charged both men with two (2) counts of Burglary and one (1) count of Entering Auto in connection to these two incidents.

These cases involve Davis and Powell unlawfully entering into two (2) homes located in south Fayette County with the intentions of stealing items from inside.

The first reported incident took place on Sunday, January 22 at approximately 12:30 PM at a home on Reynolds Place. In this case the suspects entered into the victim's vehicle and home but fled the scene after being scared off.

Later the same day Fayette County deputies were called to a home on GA Hwy 92 South to take a burglary report which occurred while the victims were at church. In this case several items were stolen from inside the home to include; a Kindle Fire computer tablet and most importantly a small heart shaped urn that contained the victim's deceased daughter's ashes. At the time the report was taken there were no witnesses or leads to assist investigators who were assigned to work this case.

On February 7 Fayette County Investigators obtained information which allowed them to recover the stolen Kindle Fire computer tablet at an apartment in the City of Morrow. Investigators learned that the person in possession of the tablet worked at a convenience store in Riverdale where he said he purchased it from two men. Investigators were able to obtain surveillance video of the two suspects selling the stolen Kindle Fire computer tablet to the gas station clerk shortly after it was reported stolen from the burglary on GA Hwy 92 South.

Upon obtaining the surveillance video, investigators forwarded it to several Atlanta area news stations in hopes the two individuals seen selling the stolen property could be identified. Investigators were contacted after the news story ran on several local news stations and were able to identify the two suspects seen in the gas station video.

The two suspects were turned over to the Fayette County Jail after their arrest where they have since bonded out. Fayette County Investigators are still asking for assistance in locating the stolen urn in this case. The stolen urn was possibly discarded after the burglary on GA Hwy 92 South. If anyone locates anything that resembles this urn or knows of its whereabouts is urged to contact the Fayette County Sheriff's Office.

Detectives have received word that the urn and box were thrown at some point from the getaway car along with pieces of costume jewelry possibly in the area of North Spalding, East Clayton, or South Fayette County.
