The Fayette County Sheriff's Office made three (3) arrests in reference to a theft that occurred on December 29, 2011 on Shenandoah Trace in north Fayette County. Fayette County Deputies and Investigators have arrested James Oliver Feltman III, 37, of Jonesboro and James Rechy, 39, of Fayetteville charging them both with Criminal Damage to Property in the 2nd Degree, Theft by Taking and Obstructing a Law Enforcement Officer. Feltman was additionally charged with Fleeing and Attempting to Elude a Law Enforcement Officer. Investigators also arrested Eowyn Rose Ausmus, 36, of Jonesboro charging her with Hindering the Apprehension of a Criminal.

This case involves Feltman and Rechy taking two (2) air-condition units from a vacant residence on Shenandoah Trace without the authority from the owner. A Fayette County Sheriff's Deputy observed Feltman and Rechy leaving the incident location in a pick-up truck loaded with the two (2) stolen air-conditioners. When the deputy attempted to conduct a traffic stop on the suspects pick-up truck a brief vehicle pursuit took place. The deputy continued to follow the suspect's truck until it came to a stop approximately two blocks from where the pursuit began inside the Shenandoah Estates subdivision.

Both Feltman and Rechy ran on foot from the deputy after the truck had come to a stop. Rechy was taken into custody by Fayette County deputies a short time later when he was seen walking on Hwy 138 just inside Clayton County. Feltman was taken into custody on December 30, 2011 at his Jonesboro home. Investigators arrested Ausmus on January 3, 2012 when she hindered investigators in their attempts to identify and arrest Feltman during the course of this investigation.

Fayette County Sheriff's Office Investigators with the assistance of the United States Marshall's Service made two (2) arrests on January 1, 2012 in connection with a theft case which occurred on October 17, 2011. Investigators have arrested Kenneth Robinson, 44, of Fayetteville and charged him with two (2) counts of Forgery in the First Degree and one count (1) of Theft by Taking. Investigators also arrested Alexis Dodson, 35, of Fayetteville and charged her with two (2) counts of Party to the Crime of Theft by Taking.

This case involves Robinson stealing approximately \$30,000 dollars from a north Fayette church where he was employed as the Senior Pastor. Robinson fraudulently put the stolen money on two (2) money orders made out to Dodson. After stealing the money from the north Fayette church both Robinson and Dodson fled to Pennsylvania where they were then arrested by the United States Marshall's Service. Both Robinson and Dodson are currently in the Fayette County Jail.

Fayette County Sheriff's Office Deputies made an arrest on January 1, 2012 in connection with a burglary that took place earlier that day. Deputies arrested Jarrod Mathew Callahan, 18, of Fayetteville and charged him with Burglary and Carrying a Concealed Weapon.

This case involves Callahan forcing entry into a residence on Wilmington Lane with the intent of stealing items from inside the home. A residential alarm notified the Fayette County 911 Center to dispatch a Fayette County Deputy to the residence. When the deputy arrived, Callahan was still inside the home attempting to remove items from inside. Deputies were able to take Callahan into custody without any injuries.
