At approximately 6:50 am on March 11, 2014, Fayette County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a hit and run call in the Princeton Chase Subdivision. Once on scene, they learned that a pedestrian had been struck by a vehicle leaving the subdivision. The victim was walking her son to the bus stop then a vehicle left the roadway and struck her. The vehicle did not stop and fled the scene. As the victim lay on the ground, her son ran to get help. She was transported to Grady Hospital for treatment. Traffic investigators recovered pieces of the suspect vehicle and conducted an intensive search for any vehicle matching the description given by the victim's son. On March 12, investigators conducted an intensive search of the subdivision at the same time the crime occurred the day previous. Investigators were able to locate the suspect vehicle and match the evidence pieces to the damage on the vehicle. 64 year old Verolyn Kennebrew of Fayetteville was arrested and charged with felony hit and run and failure to maintain lane. The victim continues to recover in ICU at Grady Hospital.

On March 2, 2014, Fayette County Sheriff's Deputies arrested 24 year old Antonio Sinkfield of College Park and 24 year old Paul Riley of Austell after they were stopped in the area of Highway 54 and the US Post Office. The men were found to be in possession of stolen mail taken from the post office in Peachtree City. The material that the men were in possession of contained the type of financial information that can be used to perpetrate identity fraud. The actions of the alert deputy prevented countless financial crimes and stopped the thieves from continuing to operate inside of Fayette County. Both men were transported to the jail and charged with 12 counts of Identity Fraud and 1 count each of loitering and prowling. The case is being investigated by the US Postal Inspectors Office and the Fayette County Sheriff's Office.
